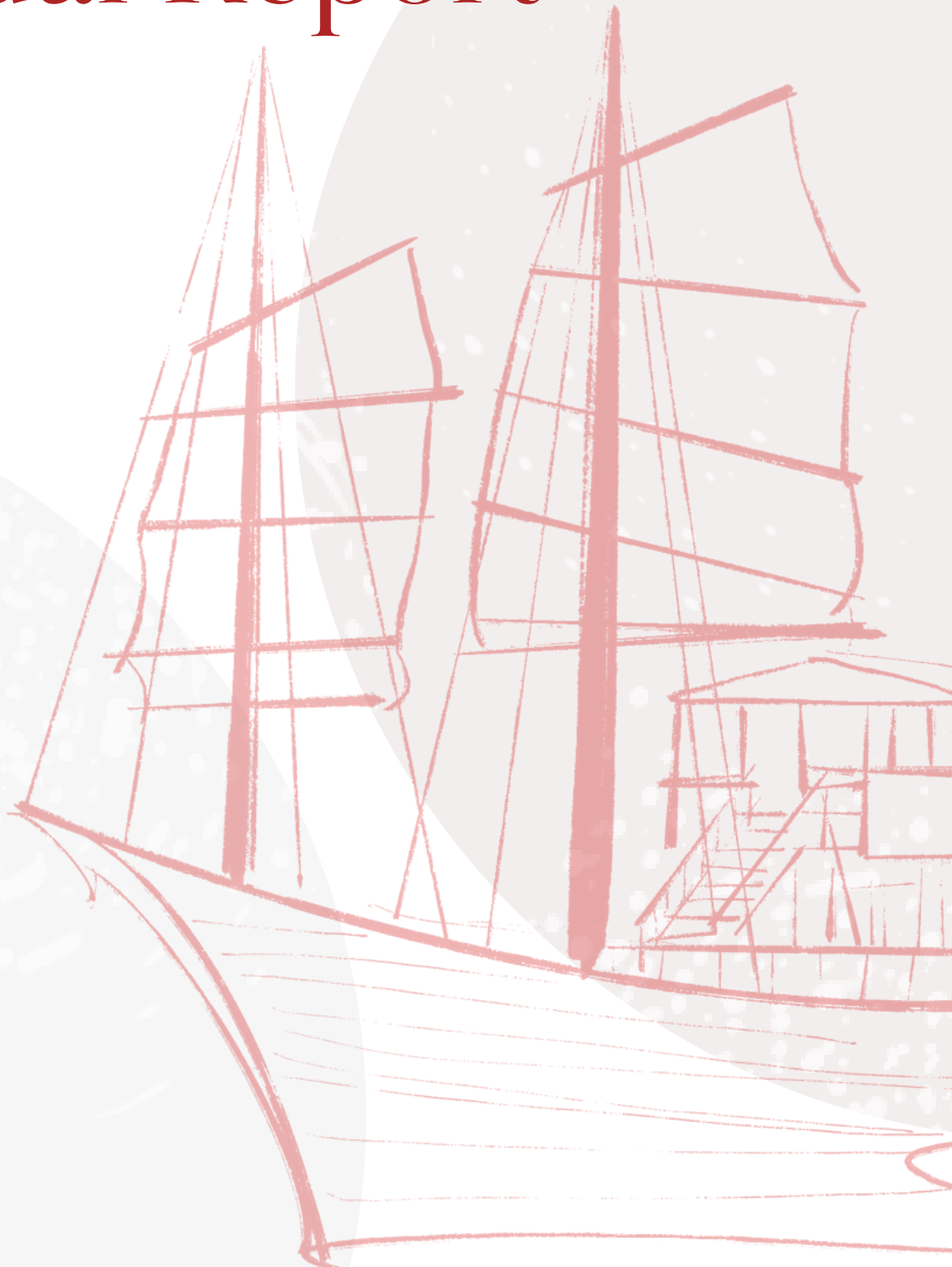

Our Mission

The Foundation The Tung and Ngai Education Foundation is dedicated to the broad advancement of education and training. Anchored in the Tung family's long record of public service and philanthropy, the Foundation initiates and supports a diverse range of programs designed to foster human capital and drive societal progress. While our scope allows for broad educational initiatives, our primary focus remains on empowering individuals to address evolving needs and creating a lasting impact on the community.

The Scholarship Program As the Foundation's flagship initiative, the Tung & Ngai Foundation Scholarship (Scholarship) was established to address a specific gap in Hong Kong's educational landscape. We recognized that while academic talent abounds, high-potential students often lack the sustained, immersive opportunities necessary to build professional networks and cultural fluency.

Our mission is to bridge this gap by transforming undergraduate studies into a purposeful mission. As China continues its rise on the global stage and the Greater Bay Area emerges as a hub for innovation, we aim to ensure Hong Kong's youth are prepared to lead. We cultivate talent that is not only academically accomplished but also possesses the cross-cultural competence, leadership resilience, and national cultural confidence required to navigate a complex world.

The Scholarship is distinguished by its sustained, multi-year framework, combining comprehensive financial support with immersive experiences that cultivate leadership and vision.

We achieve this through a holistic ecosystem. Beyond removing financial barriers through full tuition and living allowances, we provide specific funds for exchange and endeavor projects. This structure supports a journey of intellectual depth and professional connectivity, fostering a lifelong commitment to Hong Kong's development.

Governance The Tung & Ngai Foundation Scholarship is supported by the Tung & Ngai Education Foundation, a Board of Directors, an Executive Director (Scholarships), and a Scholarship Secretariat, whose members are independent and authoritative experts with rich experience in education and philanthropy. The Board of Directors is responsible for the governance of the Scholarship, and the Executive Director (Scholarships) oversees the implementation of the Scholarship.



The Tung & Ngai Foundation Scholarship

The Scholarship is shaped by four defining elements designed to foster holistic growth:

Comprehensive Financial and Project Support



The Scholarship removes financial barriers so that scholars may dedicate themselves fully to their personal and academic growth. Benefits include full tuition coverage, an annual living allowance of HK\$40,000, and subsidies of up to HK\$80,000 for exchange programs. In addition, the Endeavor Support Fund provides up to HK\$100,000 to support entrepreneurial or career-related projects in the Greater Bay Area, enabling scholars to transform ideas into meaningful impact.

Experiential Learning



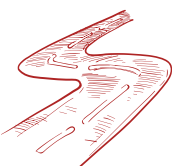
Experience is at the heart of the program. A compulsory exchange on the Mainland offers scholars direct exposure to the cultural and economic dynamism of the region, while an optional international exchange broadens perspectives and fosters global outlooks. These experiences prepare scholars to thrive in a rapidly evolving world.

Cultivation of Core Values and Skills



At every stage, the Scholarship emphasizes the development of qualities essential for leadership: independent learning, cross-cultural communication, social responsibility, and national cultural confidence. These values shape scholars not only as successful individuals but also as contributors to their communities and to society at large.

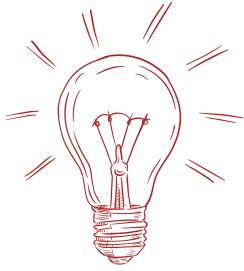
A Lifelong Community

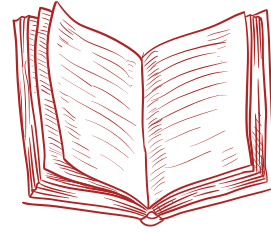
Our Year in Review: 2025 Highlights

This year marked a significant expansion of our impact and community. We are proud to have built on the success of our inaugural year, deepening our commitment to nurturing Hong Kong's future leaders.



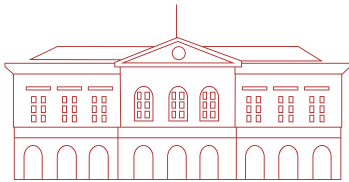

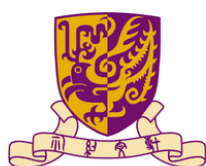

Each participating university is responsible for promoting the Scholarship, managing the application and renewal processes, and submitting a shortlist of candidates to the Foundation for final consideration.

Our Scholars

The selection process for the Tung & Ngai Foundation Scholarship began with nominations from participating universities of outstanding students. Applicants submitted an application form along with a personal statement and a learning plan. Shortlisted candidates were then interviewed by an experienced panel, guided by a structured scoring system to uphold fairness and consistency. Following the interviews, the panel engaged in careful deliberation before reaching a collective decision on the final scholarship recipients.

Listening to Our Community

To ensure the Scholarship continues to grow with our scholars, we launched our first annual survey. Feedback from the inaugural cohort was highly positive, affirming the program's strengths while pointing to meaningful opportunities for future development. Key highlights from the survey results:

Financial Support

Highest rating (4.81/5) from scholars, confirming impact in removing financial barriers and enabling all-round growth.

Mainland & International Exchange

Nearly 9 in 10 plan a Mainland China exchange, and two-thirds prepare for international exchanges

Industry Connections

Scholars prioritize closer ties with industry leaders (75%), reinforcing demand for mentorship and networking.

Engagement

In 2025, the Foundation continued to strengthen its visibility and deepen engagement with both prospective applicants and current scholars. A series of initiatives was carried out to introduce the Scholarship to a wider audience, while fostering a vibrant and connected scholar community.

Campus Talks

During the second quarter, the Foundation organized five campus talks across the five participating universities. These sessions provided an overview of the Scholarship's vision, benefits, and application process, reaching more than 100 students. The talks created a valuable platform for direct dialogue with potential applicants, enabling them to learn how the Scholarship could support their academic journeys and future aspirations.

Spring Gathering

On June 1, the Foundation hosted a Spring Scholars Gathering. Thirteen scholars from the inaugural cohort attended, joining Foundation representatives for a day of exchange and reflection. The program included updates on scholars' academic progress, service commitments, and career plans, alongside presentations of survey findings and upcoming opportunities such as the Endeavor Support Fund, exchange programs, and service-learning initiatives. Scholars also provided constructive feedback, expressing strong interest in mentorship, industry engagement, and expanded exchange activities.



Orientation Luncheon

To officially launch the second cohort of Tung & Ngai Scholars, an orientation luncheon was held on January 18, 2026. Each scholar was invited to attend with a family member, allowing both scholars and their loved ones to celebrate this significant milestone. The event commenced at 12:00 noon with a welcome address by Prof. WONG Suk Ying, who provided updates on the Scholarship Program and outlined upcoming activities for the scholars. This was followed by a Certificate Presentation Ceremony, honoring the achievements of each scholar before the luncheon began.

A highlight of the gathering was an inspiring address delivered by Mr. Alan CHOW, titled “From ‘Excellent’ to ‘Outstanding’, ‘Professional’ to ‘Cross-disciplinary’, ‘Following’ to ‘Creating’” (從「優秀」到「卓越」, 「專業」到「跨界」, 「跟隨」到「創造」), offering insights into personal and professional evolution. The event concluded by leaving the scholars with a lasting impression of support, fostering a strong sense of community and providing an encouraging start to the scholars' academic journeys.



New Year Gathering

On January 24, 2026, the Foundation hosted a New Year Gathering for the inaugural cohort. The event was attended by Board Director Ms. Betty EU, Executive Director (Scholarships) Professor WONG Suk-Ying, and Foundation representatives, creating a warm atmosphere for reflection and forward-looking discussions. During the gathering, Professor WONG provided comprehensive updates on the Foundation's initiatives, presenting key findings from recent scholar surveys and introducing further details of the Endeavor Support Fund. She also unveiled a suite of new prospective learning opportunities for 2026, including the Semester at Sea program, the Tsinghua University Summer Camp, and the Dandelion Middle School Service-Learning Project in Beijing. The gathering served as a vital platform for dialogue, where scholars shared their personal exchange experiences and offered insightful perspectives on their scholarship journeys, further strengthening the bond within the Tung & Ngai community.



Prospective Learning Opportunities

As part of our commitment to expanding our scholars' horizons, the Foundation is exploring a variety of learning opportunities to support their holistic development.

Semester at Sea

Semester at Sea is a global study abroad program that utilizes a ship as a traveling campus, offering a unique blend of academic coursework and experiential learning across multiple countries. Capitalizing on this distinctive platform, the Foundation has requested a specific quota for Tung & Ngai Scholars to participate in the ship's C.Y. Tung Program, which focuses on Sino-U.S. relations and broader international topics. This collaboration would synergize the philanthropic legacies of the Tung family by bridging Mr. C.Y. TUNG's belief that "ships carry ideas" with the mission of the late Mr. TUNG Chao-Yu and Mdm. NGAI Chue-Jai Lily to nurture future leaders. By sponsoring select scholars on this world-renowned voyage—where students engage in coursework, discussions, and meaningful connections while traveling to diverse locations—the Foundation aims to cultivate the national cultural confidence and cross-cultural resilience necessary for these young leaders to represent Hong Kong effectively and foster mutual understanding on the global stage.

Hong Kong & Macau Future Doctor Leadership Camp

In collaboration with Fudan University, the HKU Li Ka Shing Faculty of Medicine, and the Shanghai Jing'an District Government, the Foundation has been offered certain quotas for Tung & Ngai Scholars to participate in the Hong Kong & Macau Future Doctor Leadership Camp.

Dandelion Middle School Service-Learning Project

Embodying the spirit of "Learn to Serve and Serve to Learn," the Foundation is introducing a service-learning initiative at Dandelion Middle School (蒲公英中學) in Beijing, a non-profit school dedicated to children of migrant workers. This 10-day summer camp offers Tung & Ngai Scholars a profound opportunity to address timely educational topics and concerns by designing and leading workshops for migrant children in areas such as health and psychological well-being, language training, art, science, creativity and innovation, and career exploration.

Beyond the classroom, this project is an exercise in social responsibility and leadership. Scholars will work in teams to develop curricula and document their journey, supported by the Foundation. To ensure readiness for this meaningful engagement, participants will attend a mandatory pre-departure seminar, focusing on the rapid transition of Chinese society and the practical realization of Chinese socialist modernization. This program allows scholars to contribute directly to a "utopian educational experiment" that champions resilience and inclusivity.
